

1920's Project Format

(1) Title slide:

YOUR TITLE WILL BE A COMBINATION OF THE STANDARDS YOU HAVE USED. IT IS IN A SENSE YOUR THESIS. DON'T STRESS OVER THIS I WILL HELP YOU!

(2) Mission statement slide:

List the standards that you will use in your project—you may be adding to this as you do your project
Don't feel you have to use all the standards that relate to your project

(3) Text and analysis slides

TEXT: Copy and paste information from web sites or type information from your book or other text that relate to one of the standards under your topic—remember you do not have to use all that standards that are listed under the topic you have chosen

ANALYSIS: You will explain how the information that you have listed reflects one of the standards under your topic

(4) Graphics and analysis

GRAPHIC: You are to gather graphics that relate to one or more standards under your topic

ANALYSIS: You will explain how the graphic you have used reflects one of the standards under your topic.

To get and "A":

Text and analysis: You must use **8 different sources** and analyze how each relates to one or more of the standards under your topic

Graphics and Analysis: You must use **6 different graphics** and analyze how each relates to one or more of the standards under your topic

To get a "B"

Text and analysis: You must use **6 different sources** and analyze how each relates to one or more of the standards under your topic

Graphics and Analysis: You must use **4 different graphics** and analyze how each relates to one or more of the standards under your topic

To get a "C"

Text and analysis: You must use **4 different sources** and analyze how each relates to one or more of the standards under your topic

Graphics and Analysis: You must use **3 different graphics** and analyze how each relates to one or more of the standards under your topic

(5) Conclusion slide:

Explain why your topic is important or significant (why is your topic important enough that others should know about it)
